When can I access Royal Geelong Yacht Club for the event?

Full access to the boat park will be available from the 29th January 2020.

Facilities are also available for teams to set-up and train from late December and all through January in the lead up to the events.

Where are we sailing and what are the Sailing Conditions?

The course area will be located in Corio Bay which is one of the premier locations for sailing in Australia. The Bay comprises an area approximately 4nm x 2nm of clear flat waters.

The predominant southerly sea breezes give the best possible sailing conditions. These reliable and consistent winds, combined with low swells and minimal tidal flow ensure that each race is a true contest of sailing skills.

Shipping channels within Corio Bay are clearly marked and will have minimal shipping movements during the race times.



Will I have access to amenities/food and drink while at Royal Geelong Yacht Club?

The RGYC clubhouse has a restaurant, cafe and snack bar facilities that are open every day of the week.

There are many nearby restaurants, cafes, snackbars, supermarkets and other shops within a 2 to 5 minute walking distance of the club.

RGYC has men's and women's toilets, showers and change-rooms available for competitors located within our dedicated OTB Club Rooms and additional facilities in the main clubhouse.

Competitors will have access to complementary Wi-Fi within club grounds and clubhouse.





What are the Entry Fees?

Entry fees are stipulated in the table below.

Keep in mind, anyone is able to enter as they are Open Championships. However, as the World Championships is an Olympic Qualifier, the 49er Class is open to ONLY male crews, the 49erFX Class is open to ONLY female crews and the Nacra 17 Class is open to MIXED crew.

Where can we go Shopping and/or Eating?

A few favourite areas to explore:

- Waterfront Precinct Steampacket Gardens

Where can I park my car?

Whilst there is no competitor car parking available on site at RGYC, the Geelong city centre provides a range of public parking options close by.

There are a range of 3 hour parking options around the club and all day paid parking is available along sections of Ritchie Boulevard and Eastern Beach Reserve (1-2 minutes walk from the club).
