





Paris 2024 Olympic Sailing Competition 20 July – 9 August 2024 Sailing Instructions



1. RULES

Additional Rules referenced in the Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions will be published on the regatta website: <u>paris2024.sailing.org</u>

- 1.1 The regatta is governed by the rules as defined in the 2021-2024 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS). Other documents that govern the event under RRS Definition Rule (g) are listed in Notice of Race 1.
- 1.2 For Windsurfing Events, add new RRS 29.3 as follows:

"29.3 Except in the Final race, when, at the warning signal, the course to the first mark is approximately ninety degrees from the true wind then:

- 1.2.1 When at the starting signal the race committee observes a board on the course side of the starting line, the race committee may signal a general recall;
- 1.2.2 If the race committee acts under Sailing Instruction 1.2.1 and a board is identified, she shall be disqualified without a hearing, even if the race is abandoned. The race committee shall display her sail number, and she shall leave the race area immediately. If the race is restarted or resailed, she shall not sail in it. This changes RRS 36."
- 1.3 [DP] For Kite Events:

Changes on kites made from 60 minutes before the scheduled warning signal of the first race until the end of the protest time limit of the last race of the event shall be made in the launching area only.

- 1.4 For Medal Races and the Windsurfing Events Medal Series World Sailing Appendix MR, Umpired Fleet Racing, will apply and changes a number of racing rules. - 1.5 For the Kite Events Medal Series, Appendix FMS will apply. The latest version can be found on the World Sailing Website: <u>https://d7qh6ksdplczd.cloudfront.net/sailing/wp-content/uploads/2023/07/04121034/Appendix-FMS_Version-2023-06.pdf</u>

2. [DP] [NP] SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 2.1 RRS 40.1 applies at all times while afloat, except for Windsurfing and Kite Events where competitors shall wear personal flotation devices when so required under RRS 40.2.
- 2.2 Boats not leaving the boat park for a scheduled race shall promptly notify the Race Office.
- 2.3 [SP] Before leaving shore, athletes shall sign out at the Master Cabin in their assigned boat park. Athletes may sign out from 2 hours before the scheduled time of their first warning signal of the day.
- 2.4 [SP] On returning to shore athletes shall sign in at the Master Cabin in their assigned boat park within their protest time limit. For the Medal Race and Medal Series, competitors shall sign in within 30 minutes of the last boat finishing.
- 2.5 [SP] Before leaving shore to race, an athlete shall personally collect their boat's tracking module at the Master Cabin in their assigned boat park. Athletes may collect their tracking module from 2 hours before the scheduled time of their first warning signal of the day.
- 2.6 [SP] When no more races are scheduled for a boat on that day, an athlete shall deposit their tracking module at the Master Cabin in their assigned boat park within their protest time limit. For the Medal Race and Medal Series on returning to shore, an athlete shall deposit their tracking module at the Master Cabin within 30 minutes of the last competitor finishing.
- 2.7 [SP] On training days all athletes going afloat shall sign out from 60 minutes before the scheduled training session opens and sign-in within 30 minutes of the scheduled training session finishing.
- 2.8 A boat that retires from racing shall notify the race committee before leaving the race area if possible and shall complete a retirement declaration form online or at the Race Office as soon as possible after returning ashore.

3. [DP] CODE OF CONDUCT

- 3.1 Athletes and support persons shall:
 - 3.1.1 comply with any reasonable request from a regatta official,
 - 3.1.2 handle any boats and equipment provided by the organizing authority with proper care and seamanship, without interfering with its functionality, and in compliance with the Paris 2024 Equipment Regulations; and
 - 3.1.3 not in any way interfere with the functionality of supplied media or timing equipment.

- 3.2 [SP] Boats not racing shall avoid the area where boats are racing and stay clear of any official vessel.
- 3.3 Boats that are on a race area to which they are not assigned shall avoid the zone where boats are racing and any official vessel.

4. COMMUNICATIONS WITH ATHLETES

- 4.1 Notices will be posted on the Official Notice Board (ONB) located on the regatta website: paris2024.sailing.org.
- 4.2 An online system that will enable paperless submissions of hearing requests, scoring enquiries and declarations will be accessible through the Official Notice Board. In case of a system failure, hearing requests and other paper forms will be found at and shall be delivered to the Race Office.
- 4.3 Signals ashore will be displayed from the flagpole located:
 - 4.3.1 For the Opening Series: from the flagpole located adjacent to the bridge building (for the Men's and Women's Windsurfing and Men's and Women's Kite Events) and from the flagpole located inside the Marina near the Marina Master Cabin (for Men's and Women's Dinghy, Mixed Dinghy, Men's and Women's Skiff and Mixed Multihull Events).
 - 4.3.2 For the Medal Races and Medal Series: from the flagpole located adjacent to the bridge building for all Events.
- 4.4 When flag AP is displayed ashore, '1 minute' is replaced with the times in minutes shown below in the Race Signal AP. This changes Race Signal AP.

- 4.5 [SP] [NP] A boat shall not leave its assigned boat bay until flags D or D over T are displayed ashore. For boats racing on the day the warning signal will be made not less than the time in minutes shown in the table in Sailing Instruction 4.4 after flag D is displayed or not before the scheduled time, whichever is later.
- 4.6 [DP] When flags AP over H or N over H are displayed from a race committee vessel, all boats in that race area shall immediately return ashore and shall wait there for further signals. (This changes Race Signals AP over H and N over H.)
- 4.7 For Kite Events: To indicate that competitors may sail back ashore to change equipment, flag K displayed afloat and ashore with two sounds means 'Races not started are postponed. The warning signal will be made not less than 30 minutes after flag K was displayed unless at that time the race is postponed again or abandoned.'
- 4.8 For Windsurfing Events: Depending on which format will be sailed (Course Racing, Sprint Slalom or Marathon), the race committee will display the format flag ashore at least 15 minutes before flag D is displayed or afloat not later than the warning signal.

5. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 5.1 Any change to Addendum B: Competition Schedule will be posted on the Official Notice Board before 2000 on the day before it will take effect.
- 5.2 Except for changes to Addendum B: Competition Schedule, changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted either:
 - 5.2.1 no later than 2 hours before the scheduled time of the first race affected; or
 - 5.2.2 no later than 15 minutes before flag AP is removed ashore for a race that is affected.
- 5.3 Any changes to the Sailing Instructions will be approved by a World Sailing Technical Delegate.

6. FORMAT OF RACING (For Windsurfing and Kite Events see Addendums E and K)

6.1 The format for each Event consists of an Opening Series and a Medal Race.

6.2 For the Opening Series the number of races scheduled is as follows:

6.3 Initial assignments to a Medal Race will be based on the ranking available at 2000 the day before a Medal Race. Any changes to the initial assignments will be posted no later than 0800 on the day of the Medal Race. The international jury may extend these time limits.

7. [DP] RACE AREAS AND FIELD OF PLAY

- 7.1 The Field of Play including the race areas is shown in Notice of Race Addendum C.
- 7.2 For Medal Races and Medal Series, more than one race area may be used. The locations will be posted on the Official Notice Board in accordance with Sailing Instruction 5.1.
- 7.3 All boats and support vessels shall remain on the Field of Play at all times whilst afloat from 21 July to 9 August 2024. No part of a boat or support vessel shall:
 - 7.3.1 cross the boundary; or
 - 7.3.2 enter or remain on the Field of Play when it is closed, except when returning to their boat bay as required by Sailing Instructions 7.5 and 7.6.
- 7.4 While a boat is racing, the boundary ranks as an obstruction. Failure of a boundary mark to be in position will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 7.5 If any part of a boat crosses the boundary of the Field of Play, the boat may be subject to security quarantine and search before being permitted back into the Venue. The actions of the organizing authority relating to security quarantine and searches will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.
- 7.6 For Events racing, the Field of Play opens each day when flag D for that Event is displayed and closes 15 minutes after the last boat of that Event has finished the last race of the day or AP over A is shown, whichever is later. Thereafter, competitors and their support persons may only use the Field of Play to return to their boat bay as quickly as possible without interfering with any other active race areas.
- 7.7 For Events training, the Field of Play opens each day when flags D over T for that Event are displayed and closes 15 minutes after the training session ends. Thereafter, competitors and their support persons may only use the Field of Play to return to their boat bay as quickly as possible without interfering with any other active race areas.
- 7.8 Only accredited athletes and accredited support team persons are permitted on the Field of Play from 21 July to 9 August 2024.
- 7.9 The Field of Play is closed whenever the Venue is closed.

8. SCHEDULE OF RACES AND RACE AREA ASSIGNMENTS

- 8.1 The race schedule, including the time of the first warning signals and initial assignments of Events to race areas, is shown in Sailing Instruction Addendum B.
- 8.2 The race committee may reassign an Event to any race area no later than 2 hours before the scheduled warning signal. However:
 - 8.2.1 when flag AP is displayed ashore, the race area may be changed by posting a notice until 15 minutes before the AP is removed; and
 - 8.2.2 when flag AP is displayed afloat, the race area may be changed. The race committee will display flag L over the Event(s) flag(s) and move to the new race area.
- 8.3 The race committee will run a Medal Race on the Medal Race Day or the Reserve Medal Race day when at least 6 Opening Series races have been completed.
- 8.4 If at the end of the last day of the Opening Series an Event has not completed a minimum of six races the race committee will use the Medal Race or Medal Series race day and the reserve day to extend the Opening Series for that Event until at least 6 races have been completed.
- 8.5 A Medal Race or Medal Series race will not be scheduled on the same day as an opening series race for that Event.

9. COURSES

- 9.1 The diagrams in Sailing Instruction Addendum C and Addendum D show the courses, the course designations, the approximate angles between legs, the order in which marks are to be passed, and the side on which each mark is to be left.
- 9.2 No later than the warning signal, the race committee starting vessel will display the course signal and the approximate compass bearing of the first leg.

10. MARKS

10.1 Course marks will be as follows:

Race Area	Marks 1, 1a, 2, 2S, 2P, 3, 3S, 3P, 4,4S, 4P and 5	New Mark
Marseille	Green	Green with black band
Corniche	Yellow	Yellow with black band
Frioul	Orange	Orange with black band
Calanques	Pink	Pink with black band

10.2 The protector mark (P) will be Blue.

- 10.3 The starting and finishing line marks will be race committee vessels or inflatable marks of the same colour as the course marks or white inflatable marks.
- 10.4 If a gate mark is missing and has not been replaced with an object displaying flag M, the remaining mark shall be rounded to port.
- 10.5 If the race committee displays flag E before the warning signal, robotic marks may be used.

11. EVENT FLAGS

11.1 Event flags will be the text and background as defined in the table below:

12. THE START

- 12.1 The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange 'Start' flag on the race committee signal vessel and either:
 - 12.1.1 the course side of the other starting mark, or
 - 12.1.2 a staff displaying an orange 'Start' flag on a race committee vessel which is the other starting mark.
- 12.2 [DP] A buoy may be attached to the race committee signal vessel anchor line just below daggerboard depth. Boats shall not pass between this buoy and the race committee signal vessel at any time. This buoy is part of the race committee signal vessel ground tackle.
- 12.3 [DP] When a starting sequence is in progress, boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area. The starting area is defined as the area 75 meters from the starting line and starting marks in all directions.

12.4 RRS 26 and Preparatory Signals in Race Signals are deleted. Races will be started using the following signals. Times shall be taken from the display of visual signals and the absence of a sound signal shall be disregarded. This changes RRS 26, Race Signals and RRS P5.2(c).

12.5 The warning signal for each succeeding race will be made as soon as practicable.

- 12.6 For Windsurfing events:
 - 12.6.1 If a course race or slalom race is restarted or resailed, any penalty for a breach of a rule in the original race shall be applied to the next completed course race or slalom race.
 - 12.6.2 If a Marathon race is restarted or resailed, any penalty for a breach of rule 30.4 in the original race shall be applied to the next Marathon race only.

12.6.3 If a Marathon race is postponed or abandoned, and is not resailed, no penalty for a breach of rule 30.4 rule in the original race shall be applied to any other race.

This changes RRS 36.

13. COURSE CHANGES

- 13.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will:
 - 13.1.1 move the original mark if a robotic mark is in use, or lay a new mark if non-robotic marks are in use;
 - 13.1.2 move the finishing line, or
 - 13.1.3 move the leeward gate.
- 13.2 When a new mark is laid, the original mark will be removed as soon as possible. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by the original mark.
- 13.3 When Mark 1 has been changed, Mark 1a is no longer a mark of the course. It will be removed as soon as practicable. This changes RRS 33.
- 13.4 Courses will not be shortened. This changes RRS 32.

14. THE FINISH

- 14.1 The finishing line will be between a staff displaying a blue 'Finish' flag on the race committee finish vessel and either:
 - 14.1.1 the course side of the the other finishing mark, or
 - 14.1.2 a staff displaying a blue 'Finish' flag on the race committee vessel which is the other finishing mark.

15. TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

15.1 For Opening Series races, time limits and target times in minutes are as follows:

15.2 For Medal Races and Medal Series races, time limits and target times in minutes are as follows:

15.3 If no boat passes Mark 1 before the Mark 1 Time Limit the race will be abandoned.

15.4 For Windsurfing Events:

15.4.1 In Sprint Slalom or Medal Series, a race will be abandoned if:

a) The first 5 boards or the first third of the fleet, whichever is smaller, did not pass Mark 1 within the Mark 1 time limit; or

b) The first 5 boards or the first third of the fleet, whichever is smaller, did not finish within the time limit.

- 15.4.2 In Course Racing or Marathon, a race will be abandoned when the first 15 boats or the first tenth of the fleet, whichever is smaller, did not finish within the time limit.
- 15.5 Boats failing to finish within the time stated in the Finish Window, after the first boat sails the course and finishes, will be scored Did Not Finish. This changes RRS 35, A4, A5.1 and A5.2.
- 15.6 Failure to meet the Target Times will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).

16. [DP] EQUIPMENT AND EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

- 16.1 A boat or equipment may be inspected at anytime for compliance with the rules.
- 16.2 When instructed by a race official on the water, a boat shall proceed to a designated area for inspection.
- 16.3 If equipment is required to be registered by the rules, only that registered equipment shall be used.

17. OFFICIAL VESSELS

17.1 Official vessels will be marked as follows:

17.2 A boat shall not request redress due to the actions by any official vessel, drone or helicopter. This changes RRS 60.1(b).

18. SCORING (For Windsurfing and Kite Events Scoring see Addendums E and K)

- 18.1 The Low Point System of RRS Appendix A will apply.
- 18.2 A minimum of one race is required to be scored to constitute a regatta for each Event.
- 18.3 A boat starting later than 4 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes RRS A4, A5.1 and A5.2.
- 18.4 When fewer than 3 Opening Series races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores. When 3 or more Opening Series races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

- 18.5 To request a correction of an alleged error in posted race or series results, a boat may complete and submit a scoring enquiry available online or from the Race Office. Athletes' attention is drawn to Sailing Instruction 19.3.
- 18.6 RRS A8 is changed for boats competing in the Medal Race, ties in the regatta score are broken by applying RRS A8.2 to the Medal Race score. If a tie remains, ties in the regatta score are broken by applying RRS A8.1 to the Opening Series scores.
- 18.7 For the Medal Race RRS A4 is changed so that the points are doubled. RRS A5.2 is changed so that the scores are based on the number of boats assigned in that race and then doubled. Discretionary and standard penalties will not be doubled. However, the score from any Medal Race will not be excluded.
- 18.8 The boats competing in the Medal Race shall be ranked highest in the regatta. This may not apply to a boat penalised under RRS 6 or 69, the Olympic Charter, or World Sailing Regulations 19 or 35. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.
- 18.9 A boat assigned to compete in the Medal Race shall make a genuine effort to start, sail the course and finish. The penalty for a breach of this instruction will be ranking the boat tenth in the regatta. If there are 2 such boats, they will be ranked ninth and tenth, in order of their opening-series ranks, and so on. This changes RRS A2, A5.1 and A5.2.

19. PROTESTS, PENALTIES AND REQUESTS FOR HEARING REQUESTS AND PENALTIES

- 19.1 Protests and requests shall be lodged electronically via the form available on the Official Notice Board within the appropriate time limit. Submissions into this system will be considered as delivered to the Race Office. Once delivered, a hearing will be automatically listed on the list of pending hearings. If this does not show, then the protest/request has not been received. Alternatively, Hearing Request Forms will be available in the Race Office and may be submitted there within the appropriate time limit.
- 19.2 The protest time limit for each Event is 60 minutes after either:
 - 19.2.1 the last boat in the fleet has finished the last race of the day, or
 - 19.2.2 the race committee signals no more racing today for the Event, whichever is the later.
- 19.3 A request for redress based on an incident identified in a scoring enquiry will meet the time limit if:
 - 19.3.1 the scoring enquiry was submitted within the time limit specified in RRS 62.2 as changed by Sailing Instruction 19.2; and
 - 19.3.2 the request for redress is delivered as soon as reasonably possible after being notified of the race committee's response to the scoring enquiry. The response by the race committee may be notified in writing or through the online system. This changes RRS 62.2.
- 19.4 Notices will be posted within 30 minutes of the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the stated room beginning at the time posted. Hearings may be scheduled to begin up to 30 minutes before the protest time limit.
- 19.5 A list of boats that have been penalized under Appendix P for breaking RRS 42 and under Sailing Instruction 19.8 will be posted on the Official Notice Board.
- 19.6 Penalties for breaches of the Class Rules, RRS 50.1, RRS 78 or rules in the Notice of Race and Sailing Instructions marked [DP], or [SP] should the case go to a hearing, are at the discretion of the international jury and may be less than disqualification.
- 19.7 Breaches of Notice of Race 1.2 (Medical pandemic provisions) or rules in the Sailing Instructions or Notice of Race marked [NP] shall not be grounds for a protest by a boat. This changes RRS 60.1(a).
- 19.8 For breaches of a rule marked [SP], or listed in the list of standard penalties, the race committee or technical committee may apply a standard penalty without a hearing or a discretionary penalty may be applied by the international jury with a hearing. A list of these breaches and the associated standard penalties will be posted on the Official Notice Board. However, the race committee or technical committee may still protest a boat if it considers a standard penalty is inappropriate. A boat that has been penalised with a standard penalty shall neither be protested by another boat for the same incident nor can another boat request redress for this committee action. This changes RRS 60.1, 63.1 and A5.1 and A5.2.
- 19.9 When a penalty is given under Sailing Instruction 19.6 or Sailing Instruction 19.8 before a race is started, the penalty will remain if that race is restarted or resailed. This changes RRS 36.
- 19.10 In RRS 62.2(a) and 66.2(a) delete 'on the last scheduled day of racing' and replace with 'on the last scheduled day of the Opening Series and on the last scheduled day of racing for each Event'.
- 19.11 Any penalty or score adjustment imposed on the day of a Medal Race or Medal Series before boats go afloat will be notified by a notice in the launching area before flag D is displayed for that Event, or by a notice posted on the race committee vessel displaying flag L.

Sailing Instruction Addendum D

Marathon Race

D.1 Racing Area

1.1 The diagram below shows the approximate area within the Field of Play the course may be set.



D.2 The Marks

2.1 Course and gate marks shall be navigation marks, physical pink, orange, green and yellow buoys.

D.3 The Start

3.1 At the starting signal, displayed under Sailing Instruction 12.4, a gate vessel (a vessel displaying the Marathon format flag) will proceed at high and constant speed from the starting mark to the race committee signal vessel. The starting line will be between the course side of the starting mark and the course side aftermost point of the gate vessel.

D.4 The Course

- 4.1 The race committee will set one of the courses below. The mark locations will be published on the Official Notice Board no later than 2000 on the 25 July 2024.
- 4.2 Race committee vessels displaying a yellow flag will be on station close to marks 1,4,5 and 6.

MAR1	Start - 1s/1p - Western Cardinal, Sourdaras to port – If Island to port - 4s/4p - 5s/5p - 6s/6p - Finish

Sailing Instruction Addendum E

Windsurfing Events Format and Scoring

E.1 FORMAT

1.1 The intention of the race committee is to sail all three formats throughout the event on the basis of wind conditions and the forecast. The decision of which format is used is at the discretion of the race committee and a board shall not request redress based on these decisions. This changes RRS 60.1(b).

MEDAL SERIES

- 1.2 If a board breaks RRS 30.4, the race committee may signal a general recall.
- 1.3 The intention of the race committee is to signal a maximum of two general recalls per race.
- 1.4 For the Final race, RRS 30.2 is changed to read:

"30.2 If flag Z has been displayed, no part of a board's hull shall be on the course side of the starting line at the board's starting signal. If a board breaks this rule, the race committee may signal a general recall and if the board is identified, the race committee shall display her sail number before the next warning signal for that race. If the race is restarted of resailed, the board shall not start before five seconds after her starting signal. If she does so, she will be scored OCS and may be signalled under Appendix MR 3.3(a) any time after 5 seconds after her starting signal

E.2 SCORING

2.2

- 2.1 RRS Appendix B applies except that B8 is deleted.
 - A race will be scored as follows:
 - 2.2.1 A course or a sprint slalom race will be scored as one race in a series.
 - 2.2.2 A marathon race will be scored as two races in a series. Only one marathon score may be excluded.
- 2.3 A board starting later than 2 minutes after her starting signal in Course or Marathon race (1 minute for Slalom) will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4, A5.1 and A5.2.
- 2.4 A competitor's Opening Series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score(s) as follows:

Opening series Races	Discards	Comments
1-2	0	No discard
3-7	1	One worst score discarded
8-15	2	Two worst scores discarded
16 or more	3	Three worst scores discarded

- 2.5 The boards competing in the Medal Series shall be ranked highest in the regatta. This may not apply to a board penalised in a race in the Medal Series under RRS 6 or 69, the Olympic Charter, or World Sailing Regulations 19 or 35. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.
- 2.6 A competitor's final overall rank will be relative to their rank in the race they were eliminated with Final participants ranked ahead of the Semi Final participants, ranked ahead of Quarter Final participants, ranked ahead of the Opening Series participants.
- 2.7 Ties in the Opening Series shall be broken in accordance with RRS A8.
- 2.8 The first 2 (two) ranked competitors in the Quarter Final race and the second and third overall ranked competitors from the Opening Series shall advance to the Semi Final. The last 5 competitors in the Quarter Final race shall be scored in positions 6th to 10th in the Event. If the Quarter Final is not completed, competitors' final overall rank shall be their Opening Series rank.
- 2.9 The first 2 (two) ranked competitors in the Semi Final race and the first overall ranked competitor from the Opening Series shall advance to the Final. The last 2 competitors in the Semi Final race shall be scored in positions 4th and 5th in the Event. If the Semi Final is not completed and the Quarter Final is complete, competitors' final overall rank shall be determined according to the table below:

Final Overall Rank	Result
1	Opening Series rank 1
2	Opening Series rank 2
3	Opening Series rank 3
4 to 10	Their Quarter Final rank
11 and onwards	Their Opening Series rank

2.10 The winner of the Final race is the winner of the Event. The competitor scored second shall be ranked 2nd place and the competitor scored third shall be ranked 3rd place in the Event. If the Final is not completed and the Quarter Final and Semi Final are complete, competitors' final overall rank shall be determined according to the table below:

Final Overall Rank	Result
1	Opening Series rank 1
2 to 5	Their Semi Final rank
6 to 10	Their Quarter Final rank
11 and onwards	Their Opening Series rank

2.11 If there is a tie in a stage of the Medal Series between two or more competitors, it shall be broken by the following methods, in order, until all ties are broken. Ties shall be decided in favour of the competitor(s) who:

2.11.1 where qualified to sail in the latter stage of the Medal Series;

2.11.2 were ranked higher in the previous stage where the tied competitors sailed together.

This changes RRS A8.

- 2.12 For the Medal Series RRS A5.2 is changed so that scores are based on the number of competitors assigned to that race in the Medal Series.
- 2.13 The Medal Series shall not be excluded from a competitor's score neither will the Medal Series scores trigger any discards from results in the opening series.

Sailing Instruction Addendum K

Kite Events Format and Scoring

K.1 Opening series

1.1 A competitor's Opening series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score(s) as follows:

Opening series Races	Discards	Comments
1-3	0	No discard
4-6	1	One worst score discarded
7-10	2	Two worst scores discarded
11 or more	3	Three worst scores discarded

This changes RRS A2.

1.2 For the Medal Series, RRS A5.2 is changed so that those scores are based on the number of boats assigned to the that race in the Medal Series.

K.2 Medal Series

- 2.1 The Medal Series will be divided into Semi Finals and Finals.
- 2.2 The first-ranked competitor at the end of the Opening Series will progress to the Finals carrying forward two race-wins.
- 2.3 The second-ranked competitor at the end of the Opening Series will progress to the Finals carrying forward one race-win.
- 2.4 Scores in the Medal Series shall be determined by the race committee.
- 2.5 A competitor that came to the starting area but did not start or did not finish will be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of competitors that finished and were not disqualified or retired. This changes RRS A5.2.

K.3 Semi Finals

3.1 Competitors ranked 3 to 10 overall at the end of the Opening series will progress to Semi Finals, carrying forward race-wins as follows:

- 3.2 Each Semi Final will continue until one competitor collects three race-wins. The competitor with the lowest race score collects a race-win.
- 3.3 Competitors in each Semi Final will be ranked in order of the number of race-wins, from highest to lowest.
- 3.4 If there is a tie in race-wins between two or more competitors, they will be ranked in the order of their finishing positions in the last race. Any remaining ties shall be broken by using the tied competitors' scores in the next-to-last semi-final race and so on. If a tie remains, they will be ranked in order of their Opening Series ranking. This changes RRS A8.
- 3.5 The winner of each Semi Final will progress to the Finals, carrying forward 0 race-wins.
- 3.6 The race committee may cancel the Semi Finals if, in its opinion, it is necessary to do so to ensure the completion of the full Medal Series. In such case, competitors ranked 3rd and 4th in the Opening Series will progress to the Finals.

K.4 Finals

- 4.1 The Finals will continue until one competitor collects three race-wins. The competitor with the lowest race score collects a race-win.
- 4.2 Competitors in the Finals will be ranked in order of the number of race-wins, from highest to lowest.
- 4.3 If there is a tie in race-wins between two or more competitors, they will be ranked in the order of their finishing positions in the last race. Any remaining ties shall be broken by using the tied competitors' scores in the next-to-last finals race and so on. If a tie remains, they will be ranked in order of their Opening Series ranking. This changes RRS A8.

K.5 Overall Final Rankings

- 5.1 This may not apply to a competitor penalised under RRS 6 or 69, the Olympic Charter, or World Sailing Regulations 19 or 35. This changes RRS A5.1 and A5.2.
- 5.2 Competitors qualified for the Finals will be ranked in places 1-4, even if the Finals are not completed.
- 5.3 Remaining competitors in the Semi Finals will be ranked in places 5th to 10th according to their scores in the Semi Finals as follows:
 - 5.3.1 Competitors ranked 2nd in each Semi Final will be ranked in places 5th and 6th in order of their Opening Series rank.
 - 5.3.2 Competitors ranked 3rd in each Semi Final will be ranked in places 7th and 8th in order of their Opening Series rank.
 - 5.3.3 Competitors ranked 4th in each Semi Final will be ranked in places 9th and 10th in order of their Opening Series rank.
 - 5.3.4 If the Semi Finals are not completed, competitors will be ranked in order of their Opening Series rank.
- 5.4 Competitors not qualified for the Medal Series will be ranked from place 11th and on, according to their Opening Series rank. This changes RRS A2.
- 5.5 A competitor starting later than 2 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes RRS A4 and A5.
